







#### ARTICLE FORTY-THREE: REGISTRATION OF GRADUATION DISSERTATION PROJECTS

☐ The University Council outlines the regulations governing the registration of graduation research projects.

#### Registration Regulations

Students are required to register their graduation dissertation project with the course professor, as detailed in **Article Forty-Three** This registration process does not require approval from the Department or College Council. It is imperative to adhere to the established regulations, conditions, and ethical standards of scientific research as approved by the university when registering for the graduation research project.

#### **☐** Article Forty-Three

The graduation dissertation course requires a minimum of five registered students. The College Council may grant exceptions to this limit based on regulations approved by the University Council and a proposal from the Standing Committee.

#### Executive Regulations for Article Forty-Three

- If a student does not complete the graduation dissertation project within the semester, they will receive a designation of (a) or (IP). After completion, the student will receive their final grade as per **Article Thirty-Four** of the Study and Examinations Regulations.
- The students must complete and submit the research project within a maximum of two semesters, as defined in **Article 1\***.
- Registration for the graduation dissertation project will be conducted with the course instructor and does not require approval from the Department or College Council.
- Supervision of the course will be counted toward the faculty member's teaching load based on the hours specified in the approved program plan.

\*Article One: Graduation Project is a required project that focuses on a specific topic and typically spans one to two semesters, contributing to the fulfilment of an academic degree.


# The Dissertation Proposal



The dissertation proposal acts as a guiding framework for students as they prepare their dissertation projects. It articulates the envisioned approach for implementing the research methodology. The preparation of the research plan may differ based on the nature of the study and the specific scientific methods pertinent to each specialization. As such, students must adhere to the established methodology of their discipline and follow the instructions provided by their course professor.



# Graduation Dissertation Project




The Graduation Dissertation Project enables students to apply the knowledge, skills, and values gained throughout their academic coursework. Students are required to research a topic of their choice within their chosen specialization and track. This project is a mandatory component for graduation and holds a value of four credit hours within the overall program. As with other courses, it is evaluated based on the student's performance, with grades awarded as excellent, very good, good, acceptable, or failing.

## **GRADUATION DISSERTATION PROJECTS**

After completing their academic courses, students undertake a graduation research project in two stages. These stages are carefully designed to help students develop specialized knowledge within their fields, as well as essential skills such as effective communication, in-depth analysis, and critical evaluation of complex concepts. This comprehensive process prepares students to create and contribute new insights and knowledge to their disciplines.

The <u>first stage</u> focuses on the **Dissertation Proposal Course**, where students formulate and present their research project topic.

The <u>second stage</u> is dedicated to the actual writing and completion of the **Dissertation Project**.



#### **Recommended Attributes of Master's Graduation Dissertation Projects**

It is advisable, although not required, that Master's Graduation Research Projects exhibit both novelty and originality.



## **Novelty refers to the following concepts:**



- A The *uniqueness* of the topic or most of its details.
- B A fundamental *change* in information, sources, and knowledge that impacts previous research.
- C The introduction of *new research tools* that are relevant to the topic.



#### **Originality and innovation encompass the following ideas:**

- A Exploring an area that has *never been researched* before or addressing *gaps* in existing studies.
- B Utilizing data in *innovative ways* can uncover results that were previously *unseen*.
- C The application of *new research tools* can lead to discoveries that *have not been identified* before.
- D Employing established research tools in different contexts may yield alternative outcomes
- E Gathering new data and analyzing it to obtain *fresh outcomes*.
- F Addressing *critical problems*.
- G Implementing theoretical knowledge to develop new practical applications.





#### **DISSERTATION PROPOSAL COMPONENTS**

A dissertation proposal generally includes the following components:

- **Title:** The title should be concise, reflective of the topic, and clearly delineate its scope and dimensions.
- **Introduction:** This section should address the study's topic and significance, outline the reasons for selecting the topic, define the study's objectives, and present the research questions.
- Literature Review: This section summarizes key studies relevant to the topic and compares them to the research questions. It also identifies gaps in the existing literature and describes the contributions of the proposed research.
- **Methodology:** This section will outline the research methodology, the tools used for research, the rationale behind the terms, and any limitations encountered during the study.
- Chapter Outlines: This section outlines the structure of the dissertation project, including the introduction, preface, chapters, subsections, topics, conclusion, and indexes. It is crucial to maintain methodological coherence and a balanced approach across all sections.
- Sources and References\*: The most important primary sources and references will be referred to in this research, according to the scientific method for recording references.








#### 6. ABSTRACTS:

The abstract is a summary of the dissertation project, provided in both Arabic and English. It must cover all aspects of the research. The text should be formatted in Times New Roman font for English and Sakkal Majal font for Arabic. The length of the abstract should not exceed 350 words for a master's degree dissertation project. It should present the topic, objectives, methodology, and scope of the research. Additionally, it should briefly describe the methods used and the procedures followed, while highlighting the most important ideas.



## **BINDING OF DISSERTATION PROJECTS**

- **❖** The outer cover must be printed according to the specifications outlined on the title page and must adhere to the following guidelines:
  - The cover will be hardcover and feature luxurious binding.
  - The binding colour for master's dissertation projects is green.
  - The text on the outer cover will be printed in gold and should follow these arrangements:
    - The phrase "A Non-thesis Research Project Submitted for the Requirements of the Degree of Master's in English Literature."
    - College name
    - University name
    - Month and year in both Hijri and Gregorian calendars
    - Academic degree (Master's)
    - The title centred
    - The student's name at the bottom of the spine
  - The information on the dissertation project spine will also be printed in gold, following the same arrangement as mentioned above.
  - The inner cover will be printed in gold on polished white paper.
  - > The direction of the writing should be from bottom to top at the heel of the dissertation project.





#### **DISSERTATION PROJECT SUBMISSION PROCEDURES**

After completing the dissertation project and receiving the corresponding grade, the graduate student must submit a graduation request for the Master of Arts program through the Higher Education System (OLIA). This submission must include an electronic copy of the dissertation project.



✓ The student is required to provide a printed copy to the Central Library at Imam Mohammed ibn Saud Islamic University.
