Course Description

English Language (Medical Terminology) introduces students to the specialized vocabulary used in the study and practice of medicine. Its goal is to enable students to transition from reading general English texts to the rapid comprehension of medical textbooks they will encounter in their first year in the College of Medicine. This course focuses on rapid acquisition of medical vocabulary based on the understanding of how prefixes, suffixes, and root words from Greek or Latin are combined to form modern medical terms.

Course Objectives .

The course content will focus on meeting the course objectives described below:

- 1. Developing a strong student base of critical medical vocabulary.
- 2. Introducing students to body systems and their associated terminology.
- 3. Encouraging student interest in the study of medicine and awareness of its many facets.
